2307720 Research Methods In Psychology

(3 crd)

Covers research methods applied to psychological research including experimental, quasi-experimental and correlation methods. The limitations of each method is emphasized and statistical techniques applied in data analysis are covered.

2307731 Learning and Cognition (2)

(3 crd)

A study of the major theories of learning; classical and operant conditioning, and recent cognitive models, with discussion of related empirical evidence.

2307733 Psychology pathology

(3 crd)

the study of mental illness either functional or organic. Causes symptoms, and classification will be studied through the life span, from childhood, adulthood to aging.

2307750 Human Development (2)

(3 crd)

A study of the recent theory and research in the various aspects of human development with an emphasis on cultural factor affecting cognitive, language and emotional development across the life span.

2307760 Social Psychology (2)

(3 crd)

An in depth study of topics in social cognition, self-perception; social influence; dynamics of interpersonal relations and the significance of social support.

2307761 Psychology and Work

(3 crd)

The study of human behavior in work settings and the external/internal variables that correlate with work productivity and satisfaction in these settings.

2307773 Clinical Neuropsychology

(3 crd)

The recent scientific studies related to the relationship between brain and human normal and abnormal behavior. Also, it covers disorders, diseases of central nervous system and developmental disorders, syndromes such as amnesia, aphasia, measurement and assessment scales used in this regard will be introduced.
